# ORGANISATIONAL PROFILE Darkroom Contem

Darkroom Contemporary Dance Theatre exists as a vehicle to reimagine dance within contemporary society, through innovation & interdisciplinary collaboration. The company produces works that delight, excite, engage and inspire.

Based in Cape Town, South Africa, Darkroom Contemporary was founded in 2010 by Louise Coetzer and Oscar O'Ryan, with the aim to develop work opportunities for the multitude of talented dancers produced by local training institutions. Coetzer, a dancer and choreographer, and O'Ryan, a photographer and filmmaker, bring together expertise from their respective fields to form a dynamic partnership. Darkroom Contemporary is recognized for delivering innovative, unexpected works of the highest artistic standard, simultaneously creating unique audience experiences and new ways of appreciating dance.

The company regularly stages works in unexpected performance areas, transforming ordinary spaces into intriguing, multi-faceted arenas. Darkroom Contemporary's dance film works sits alongside its performance projects, making the work accessible to a larger global audience through the medium of film and digital media.

Projects spearheaded by the founders provide platforms and creates opportunities for skills development and exchange among all artists involved. Project collaborators include dancers, physical performers, visual artists, sound designers, photographers, filmmakers and digital artists. Darkroom Contemporary has implemented a wide range of performance, film, developmental and educational projects in the Western Cape and Gauteng. The company operates as a non profit organization with the objectives to promote dance, theatre, and dance film through a variety of projects.







### VISION & MISSION

VISION: To present dance theatre in ways that are current, relevant, innovative and accessible. To use movement as a tool to communicate ideas, create unique audience experiences, open up dialogue and initiate collaboration across multiple creative disciplines. To provide opportunities for trained performers and arts practitioners through dance performance and film projects while encouraging audiences to appreciate and support the art of dance.

### **ARTISTIC DIRECTORS REPORT**

#### DARKROOM // a space for developing CONTEMPORARY // of the times

Darkroom Contemporary's 2018/2019 season of activities concluded our NLC Funded Gauteng tour, and expanded on our range of developmental, performative and film projects.

Darkroom Contemporary performance projects during 2018/2019:

March 2018 saw a very productive time as we performed in Gauteng and Cape Town as part of NLC funded project In C. Performances in Gauteng included two very well attended performances at Dance Umbrella in JHB, and an exciting short residency space at William Kentridge's Centre For The Less Good Idea where Darkroom Contemporary's CLONE formed part of the Centre's FOR ONCE Programme, the opening performance being live streamed. This programme included a performance by Italian violinist Luca Ciarla in collaboration with visual artist Keziat. This opened up an opportunity for Darkroom Contemporary dancers to collaborate as part of Luca and Keziat's interactive performance. A wonderful opportunity for all.

In C I DOUBLE BILL then returned to Cape Town for a performance season at Magnet Theatre. In May, Darkroom Contemporary performed ANIMA at the Zeits MOCAA for the opening of Ruby Swinney's HUMAN NATURE, the museum's first temporary exhibition opening. August saw the next leg of the In C Project IN C I DECONSTRUCTED at Youngblood Arts & Culture. In October Darkroom Contemporary participated in the Baxter Dance Festival with BETWEEN THE SKY AND THE GROUND. In January 2019 Darkroom Contemporary was invited to participate in the FREESPACE PROJECT at Zeits MOCAA. This free public event saw Darkroom Contemporary's performative response to the politics of GENDER & SPACE and MEMORY & SPACE. In February of 2019 work started on research & development phases of a new interdisciplinary performance as part of NEW WORKS Project funded by the NAC.

Dance Film projects included a screening of THE FORGOTTEN at 40 North Festival in California, USA. Post Production was concluded on new dance film project LACUNA, to be included in the first ANTIDOTE Festival in the Netherlands in June 2019.

Our development initiatives included host of schools performances and workshops linked to IN C in March 2018. An educational Schools Performance was hosted at UCT before the Gauteng Tour. In Gauteng workshops were presented at WITS Drama For Life, Moving Into Dance, and Oakfields College. In Cape Town workshops were presented at the Cape Academy of Performing Arts, along with the highly popular ongoing STUDIO SESSIONS series.

Public performance and audience development initiatives included a series of performance and film installations as part of First Thursdays. These free public events saw audiences enjoying new representations of dance in public space. In January 2019, Darkroom hosted UNFINISHED Volume 7 at Youngblood Gallery. This iteration of the popular experimental performance event included contributions from visiting Dutch artists Doke Pauwels, Joost De Haas and Marnix Dorrestein, along with dance maker Jared Musiker, visual artist Sonya Rademeyer and sound artist Gustavo Fasani.

Further educational and audience development initiatives included panel discussions at WITS Art School for Dance Umbrella, and at Zeits MOCAA. Linked to its performance projects, Darkroom Contemporary's apprentice programme saw 18 trainee dancers participate in rehearsal and performance processes throughout the year.

In November 2018 Darkroom Contemporary's MEMBERSHIP PROGRAMME was launched online. This rewards programme invites Darkroom Contemporary audiences to contribute to its sustainability through becoming a member. The programme will be launched officially at Darkroom's upcoming performance events.

#### LOOKING AHEAD

Our upcoming performance and film projects focus on expanding into the visual arts and digital arts spheres in a bid to reach more diverse audiences. We continue working towards establishing new, and deepening existing partnerships. Our planning now also shifts towards Darkroom Contemporary's ten year commemorative performance season, in July 2020.

I am thankful to every individual and organisation who has impacted our growth through sharing of advice, resources, generosity or optimism. We are fortunate to be surrounded by a community of teachers, supporters, advocates and friends cheering us on every step of the way.

LOUISE COETZER (b 1980, South Africa) is a dance artist & choreographer working within the genres of site-specific performance creation, dance choreography for the stage, and dance film. Her works are experiential, experimental and innovative, and often have interdisciplinary collaboration at their core.

Coetzer approaches dance making as a medium for narrative and connection - that of the bodies within space, but also with the aim of connecting dance as art form to the world outside the studio or theatre, and to other art forms. This act of connecting the dance making process to that of another artistic language has inspired, and often demanded constant new approaches to the work, and spills over into her site-specific performance and dance film projects.

OSCAR O'RYAN (b 1978, South Africa) is a photographer and videographer specializing in capturing movement and dance as well as reportage style visual stories. He works with a range of theatre companies including The Baxter Theatre, The Cape Dance Company, Jazzart Dance Theatre, The Baxter Dance Festival, Infecting the City Festival, Dance For All, New Africa Theatre, and Skenkonst Sormland (Sweden), capturing rehearsal, performance, marketing and studio photography.

He has launched numerous personal projects which focus on storytelling through reportage style photography. He has shown solo exhibitions at Youngblood Gallery, Let There Be Light, City Hall and the Baxter Theatre Centre.

This process included an international intern, Jenna Corker from Edinburgh College in Scotland completing a dance placement internship with Darkroom Contemporary, and Nikita Deyers from Brackenfell High School in Cape Town completing a Job Shadow assignment

Darkroom Contemporary facilitated another practical skills development trainee programme, linked to the second leg of In C performances during July/August 2018. This initiative invited a group of 5 young dance students/recent graduates to participate in the company rehearsal period where they learnt new skills and developed their practical abilities. The trainees performed along with the company as experiential learning opportunity.




